

Did you happen to see the Service of Prayer for the Nation at the Washington National Cathedral on Tuesday, Jan. 21, the day after President Trump's inauguration? I gather that it was part of the scheduled Inauguration activities, along with the balls, parties, press conferences, etc. The Cathedral described it as "an interfaith Service of Prayer for the Nation... Later on I checked again, and it was STILL going, with a person delivering a sermon containing so many of the buzz-word phrases used by the left to scold us heartless people on the right, like "unity" and understanding of people who are different from us, and yadda, yadda, barf!

I felt BAD that President Trump was subjected to that, not only the scolding but also the idea that this is just another "Christian" religion, along with the many other versions of it. Actually, I guess that it IS just another variety of "Christian" religion, and it has nothing to do with following the Living God as we know Him in Jesus Christ by the Holy Spirit, thereby committing your whole life to Him in surrender and obedience to Him.

Unfortunately, when mankind encounters the spiritual, the immediate response is to systematize it into doctrines and principles. Then the doctrines and principles are organized into an institution that becomes a religion, defined by the dictionary as "a personal set or institutionalized system of religious attitudes, beliefs, and practices". Wars have been fought over differences of doctrine and practice, shedding much blood in the name of some prophet or leader who may even have stood against such stuff.

Think of the Muslims who are divided into several groups, two of which are the Sunni and Shiite versions, who hate and kill each other as well as killing us. The "Christian" religion is not innocent, as the Crusades and the Spanish Inquisition demonstrate. There is strife between practioners

of other religions and their variants in other places, also, like India, where Muslims, Hindus, and Buddhists clash, with a few Christians in the mix, also.

When my dad (Ernie Gommel) came to know God, he had been raised "in the church" and was a typical American "Christian". He was a good man with strong ideals and ethics, but his heart had never



encountered and surrendered to God. Then when he did surrender, he stopped his life's activities and immediately focused on seeking

God's direction for the remainder of his life. He resigned his position with a pipe manufacturing mill, giving up a successful climb up the business ladder and spent months, along with my mother, figuring out what the next step should be.

He felt led to go to seminary to become a minister in the Disciples of Christ denomination and so moved the family to Indianapolis, Indiana, where he went to Christian Theological Seminary and graduated with highest honors. During those Indiana years, he was assistant minister and then senior minister in two different churches.

It wasn't long before he knew that serving in an institutional church wasn't going to work for him. His message to the congregation was that God calls us to serve Him with our whole being, and with abandon, so that God was not to be our partner or the guy we drag along with us to approve what we do with our lives. God is to be the One who leads us and we follow Him and obey Him with all aspects of our lives.

Ultimately Gommel left institutional religion and started to meet with a small group at our house, first in Indianapolis, and then in Reche Canyon (Colton), down below. And that led to our buying the Hitchin Post Market, and 14 years later Lucerne Valley Market, by God's leading, and as a non-religious way to serve Him and to share His Spirit. He, and we, were FREE to follow God, by His Holy Spirit, and not be caged in the bars of some denomination's doctrines and practices.

Hence, "Following God is Something Else." It is not practicing religion. It is living moment by moment, day by day, seeking God's will and trying to do it. It is living by the guidance of His Holy Spirit Who is in each of us who choose to let Him be there. (Yes, the Bible is foundational to all of this, for those of you who worry that it is minimized.) It is meeting with others in a Body of Believers, who support each other spiritually, and to whom each is accountable, so that we are not simply free agents floating around, reveling in our self-deluded ideas of God's approval.

Most importantly, we are not limited in boxes of manmade denominational doctrines but are free to relate to the living God Himself, by His Holy Spirit. Wow! What a difference. No dead prayer services in beautiful cathedrals that have no life inside

Clump Of Cells Dies At 67


